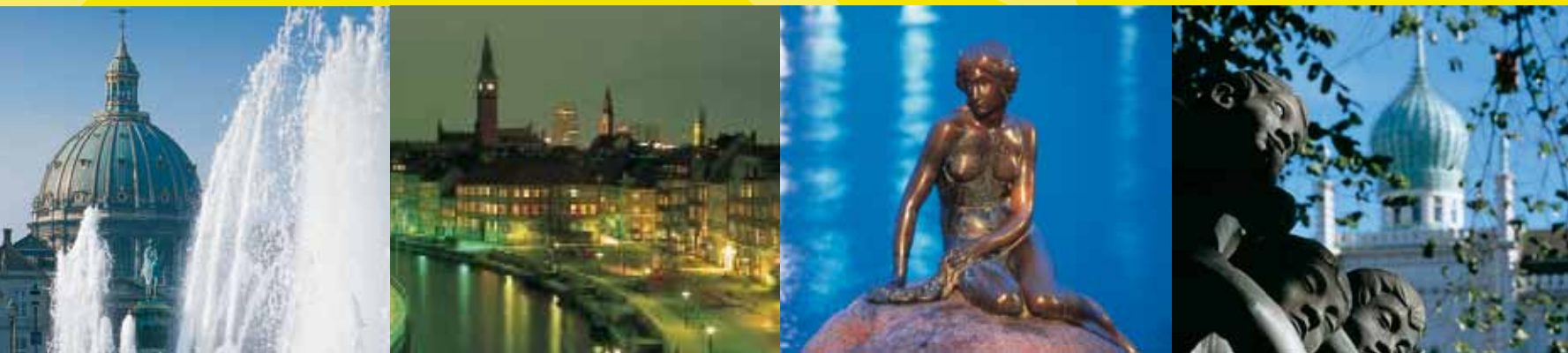

## General Information

### Copenhagen

Copenhagen is at the cross-roads between Continental Europe and Scandinavia and the Baltic area. The sea and waterfront dominates the city that has kept an old-world charm. The city's old streets and architecture blends in with modern design symbolising its rapid growth. The newly inaugurated Royal Opera offers a magnificent contemporary perspective of Denmark.

The modest size of the city is a great advantage for visitors. The best sights are within the centre which has a bustling pedestrian shopping area called Strøget. Most roads have a bike lane, and compared with other European cities there is little traffic. Visitors may enjoy a leisurely stroll in a relaxed and safe environment – or a bicycle ride using the ubiquitous “free of charge” city bikes.

### Congress Venue

Tivoli Congress Center is located in the heart of Copenhagen within walking distance of Tivoli garden, Town Hall Square, the pedestrian shopping streets and the waterfront. Dramatic in architecture and excellently located Tivoli Congress Center is the obvious choice in Copenhagen for conferences, meetings, exhibitions and events. Tivoli Congress Center will open at the end of 2010.

Tivoli Congress Center is the largest conference centre in the central Copenhagen area. Its Congress Hall alone accommodates up to 2,500 attendees, in addition to two large auditoria and a variety of large and smaller conference and meeting rooms.

### Commercial Exhibition

The Congress will accommodate and welcome commercial exhibitions. The exhibition area will be located adjacent to the meeting facilities, and will also serve as lounges for coffee and other refreshments. For further details please contact the Congress Secretariat as early as possible.
